Our three text drivers this half term are stories that link to the overall topic of West End wanders.

To begin the summer term, we will be focusing on the text 'The Day the Crayons came Home'. We will be writing a postcard from a piece of equipment in our classroom.

Our second text driver 'Last stop on Market Street' will be used for the last two writing journeys. Our first journey using this text will be writing a setting description about a landmark in West End. The second journey will be a recount of a walk around West End.

Spelling and Phonics

We are continuing to focus on our next sounds and 'special friends' in our phonics groups through our phonic program Read, Write Inc.

Alongside our phonics program, we continue to focus on special friend in class phonics and spellings linked to their taught sounds are sent home to practise via SeeSaw.

Reading

This term, we will continue to read as part of the RWI phonics program. We will also be reading a variety of book through the Talk through Stories RWI program. Inference, vocabulary, prediction and retrieval are reading focuses for this term.

Reading at Home

We have been finding so many times and places where we can practise our reading around us. Reading 'little and often' is the best way to keep motivation and enjoyment going at home. Will you achieve a 'reading milestone' certificate this half term?

Handwriting

We will continue practising lowercase letters, ensuring they begin and end at the correct points and sit on the line. Keep up your fun practise at home!



Maths

Mass and Volume

To begin the term, we will focus on mass and volume. Within practical and hands on lesson we will be understand how to measure and compare both mass and volume and understand when something in heavier and lighter and full and empty.

Place Value (Up to 50)

We will build on the place value concepts that we learnt with numbers up to 20, 1 more and 1 less, estimating and using number lines and part whole models.

Multiplication and division

We will be counting in 10s, 20s and 5s using concreate materials to being the unit. We will then recognise and add equal groups using arrays and identify doubles.

About the Topic!

Out topic focus this half term is all about being a West End Wander. We will be exploring the local area and using our geographic and writing skills to instil an interest and love of their local area.

Geography

Our focus in Geography is using mapwork and fieldwork to explore our local area of West End. With our local walk, we will learn what it is like in our local area, the significance of it and compare the types of jobs and house in the area.

English

Our three text drivers this half term are twisted tales to get us thinking about different settings and characters.

To begin the half term we will write our own versions of Little Red Riding Hood.

We will then be using our best descriptive language for 'the place where the Wild Things live'.

For our final writing journey in Year 1, we will be using a text to transition to Year 2.

Spelling and Phonics

We are continuing to focus on our next sounds and 'special friends' in our phonics groups through our phonic program Read, Write Inc.

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Maths

Multiplication and division

We will be counting in 10s, 20s and 5s using concreate materials to being the unit. We will then recognise and add equal groups using arrays and identify doubles.

Fraction

We will be recognising and finding a half and quarter of an object, shape or quantity.

Position and direction

For position and direction, we will be describing turns and the position left and right.

Place value (Within 100)

We will start this maths block by counting from 50 to 100, partitioning numbers and then comparing these numbers.

About the Topic!

We will end Year 1 focusing on a traditional fairy tall: The Big Bad Wolf.

In DT, we will get the chance to make our very own structure just like the 'Three Little Pigs' and test if it is strong enough to withstand the puff of the Wolf.

DT

For our final DT unit in Year 1, we will be designing and making structures using everyday materials just like the 'Three Little Pigs'. We will be testing our structures just like the Big Bad Wolf did to the pig's houses. Will they stay standing.

Science
