

Saint James pupils practise what they preach about Climate Change

Taylor Swift, arguably the biggest popstar in the world currently, is also the biggest celebrity CO² polluter of this year so far. Taylor's private jet has amassed a vast 22,923 minutes in the air -that equates to 15.9 days. Not an inconsiderable amount. Multi-billionaire television host Oprah Winfrey often speaks out on Climate change, however she has emitted an estimated a whopping 3,493.17 tonnes of CO² from her use of her private jet this year alone. That is 499 times more than the average person's total annual emissions. However, one of the biggest hypocrites is Leonardo DiCaprio. The actor, famed for his role as a fictional passenger on the ill-fated liner RMS Titanic, is one of the biggest consumers of gas guzzling private jets and carbon-emitting super yachts. Transportation that is significantly more polluting (although probably more likely to arrive at its intended destination)! Despite this, DiCaprio has delivered speeches before the UN and even starred in films to bring attention to the issue of Climate change.

No such allegations and aspersions can be levied at the children from Saint James. Last Friday, Adele, Jude and Faye from Year 5 gave a presentation on Climate Action at the Hampshire Governor Services Annual Conference; their form of transport? An electric car, of course!

Accompanied by Reverend Linda and Mrs Callard, the children attended the conference at Norton Park Hotel and presented their learning and perspectives on the Climate Unity projects Saint James has participated in over the last four years. Speaking to an audience of professional adults is undoubtedly a daunting task for a nine or ten year-old child. When that audience numbers over one hundred, it becomes a formidable task for many adults. However, as it appears, not for our courageous and knowledgeable Year 5 pupils. Calmly and with confidence, assurance and authority they spoke about the climate issues we have explored and the sustainable action we have implemented during these projects.

It wasn't only adults who had a lasting impression cast upon them by the pupils from Saint James – new friendships were made with pupils from two secondary schools; Cranbourne and Wildern. The children showed mutual respect as they discussed and exchanged ideas on sustainability.

As the only primary school present, all three of the children represented Saint James to an impeccably high standard and were a credit to the school throughout the visit. We were extremely proud. Well done, Adele, Jude and Faye!

Parents' Evening at Saint James

We are at the time of year again where we would like to welcome you to Parents' evening at Saint James. This is a valuable opportunity to discuss your child's development and have the chance to ask any questions directly with their teacher.

Parents' evenings are being held on **Wednesday 13th** and **Thursday 14th November 2024** and you are offered a ten-minute slot to discuss your child's progress. Time slots are booked using your on-line Arbor account - if you are having difficulty with this, please contact the school office. The booking system will close at 10pm on **Monday 11th November 2024**.

All parent interviews will be held in the main hall. For this reason, please arrive promptly to avoid congestion. We recommend you do not arrive more than 5 minutes before your appointment. We would discourage you from bringing children to these meetings as this is an opportunity for the teacher to give you a very brief update and space is limited.

For those parents who are unable to find childcare, we are providing a small crèche in a classroom next to the main hall, supervised by school staff. This crèche is for Saint James school children only and not for younger toddlers and babies. Please enter the hall via the side doors near the office, walk to the opposite end of the hall and go through the right-hand side doors. The crèche is the first room on your right.

Teachers will talk to you about how your child is getting on generally, whether their Reading, Maths and Writing are at age-related expectations, and how you can support your child at home. This is also a good opportunity for you to talk about any concerns, however if you have difficult and lengthy concerns please make a separate appointment, as Parents' evening will only offer you a 10-minute opportunity.

We look forward to welcoming as many of you as possible to our first Parents' evening of the academic year.
